How does God redeem the brokenness of human society?

Followers of Jesus Christ use their redemptive influence to...

- I. Incarnate gospel values in the midst of a fallen world Col. 3:22-4:6
 - a. The inexcusable and inevitable nature of broken social systems in a fallen world (Gen 6:).
 - b. God's gracious intervention to limit the effects of sin and provide redemption (cf. Dt. 16:9-15, John 8:34-36, Gal. 4:4-7).
- II. Display God at work redeeming and reconciling people in their communities- Onesimus' story Col. 4:7-18, Philemon.
 - a. Onesimus: from Runaway slave to beloved brother.
 - b. Philemon: from slave-owner to disciple-maker.

The gospel of Jesus Christ is our only hope for reconciliation
Like Philemon, Be a disciple-maker!**
