## The Pursuit of Happiness: Empty, yielded grounded Matthew 5:1-5

Why must God break our pride before he can bless us?

God's blessing is only available to those who are willing to receive as a gift what they cannot earn because...

- I. They are spiritually bankrupt and must renounce the pleasures of this world: emptied ones brokenness Matthew 5:1-3.
  - a. Blessed ones: μακάριος 50 in NT, 13 gospel of Matthew 11:6, 13:16, 16:17, 24:46. Translates אֵשֶׁר in LXX (cf. Psalm 1:1, 2:12, Dt. 33:29).
  - b. The poor in spirit and the kingdom cf. Lk. 16:19-31, 12:15-20.
- II. They feel the deep pain of their mortality and contrition for sin that makes them receptive to God's comfort suffering ones yieldedness Matthew 5:4.
  - a. Those who mourn πενθοῦντες (10 times in NT- outward sorrow especially for the dead Matt 9:15, divine judgment Rev. 18:11, and sin 2 Cor 12:21).
  - b. They will be comforted: παρακληθήσονται (109 times in NT) cf. Is. 40:1-11, Lk 2:25, Matt. 14: 36, Rev. 21:3-5, 2 Thess. 2:16.
- III. Their true success is measured not by what they can earn but by what God can give humble ones groundedness Matthew 5:5.
  - a. The meek: πραεῖς 4 times NT (where we get word for "friend" in English)- Matt 5:5, 11:29, 21:5, 1 Peter 3:4- someone who has a friendly attitude towards life rather than a confrontative attitude- humility from lat. Humus "eartly, grounded."
  - b. Inheriting the earth: Psalm 37:9,11.

Humanity's true greatness comes from realizing that, in spite of how small we are, God has provided a way to relate to him because of how great he is.

- 1. Before God can bless us, he must break us. When was the last time you came to him with a contrite heart? Psalm 51.
- 2. Empty, yielded, grounded: Which one of these three words captures the area where God wants you to grow?
