- I. They acknowledge God's sovereign election, direction, and provision in their family of faith 2 John 1-3.
 - a. The unity of believers in truth and love (cf. John 17:16-23, Pr. 3:1-4).
 - b. God's sovereign election, direction, and provision (will be with us v. 3).
- II. They are uncompromisingly committed <u>to both</u> the abiding truth and love of God the Father and his Son Jesus Christ embodied in their family of faith 2 John 4-6.
- III. They answer God's call to raise a new generation of Christ followers paving the way for their walk in obedience to God's word. 2 John 4-6.
