  - b. Two kinds of wisdom: selfish ambition or sacrificial service James 3:13-18.
- II. Abuse privilege for taking instead of giving Matthew 20:22-23.
  - a. Entitlement.
  - b. Grace.
- III. Abuse privilege oppressing others instead of setting them free Matthew 20:25-28, 17-19, Philippians 2:1-11.
